What to Expect. The roads are getting a new multi-step treatment designed to extend the life of the road.

Step 1 – Crack Sealing. Cracks in the asphalt are cleaned and sealed. It takes approximately 30 days for the sealant to cure.

Step 2 – Surface Treatment (After Cure Period). After the cure period for Step 1, an asphalt emulsion is sprayed onto the roadway followed by a layer of pre-coated aggregate (gravel) that is rolled into the emulsion. Some roads will get two layers of aggregate. It takes about two weeks for this layer to cure. The county requests that drivers reduce their speed to 15 mph while the aggregate is seating into the asphalt emulsion. Some loose aggregate is expected to remain during this cure period. After the cure period, the road will be swept resulting in a smoother surface.

Step 3 – Asphalt Finishing Seal. Following the cure period and sweeping in Step 2, the road will receive an Asphalt Finishing Seal. This final application will provide a smoother and more uniform finished surface.

None of our roads have received Step 3 yet. The county expects to complete Step 3 by the end of September.

Your Feedback Matters. SALUTE to all our residents who provided constructive feedback to the county! Originally, the county did not include Step 3 (Asphalt Finishing Seal) in this treatment. However, all the feedback prompted the county to add the third step to help mitigate our concerns.
